### NEWS UPDATES

**RMG/Bovis:** Most of us will have noticed that there has been a concerted effort recently to tidy up the Development including trimming the grass verges, weeding the planted areas and generally making Woolley Grange a more attractive place to live. RMG and Bovis have at long last got their acts together (with a little bit of nudging from the WGRA) and have agreed a plan which will include the transfer of the public open spaces to RMG once Bovis have got them up to a manageable state. The cost of this remedial work is being met by Bovis and being carried out by TC Landscapes. Further planting is to follow towards the end of the year and RMG are to produce a draft management schedule for the Development. We finally seem to be making some headway but a lot still has to be sorted so bear with us.

**Childrens Play Area:** Bovis still think that the "Village Green" (the triangle of land at the Darton end of the development opposite the Bovis Sales office) is still the best place to situate the Childrens Play Area, however from speaking to a number of residents it seems that we disagree. We are trying to find a more suitable space on the site to put to Bovis as an alternative and would be grateful if residents could provide some suggestions. **Spoil Tip:** The decision to approve the 5 year application to continue importing soils and composting the spoil tip at the entrance to the site has been deferred to a future date (as yet undetermined) following a flood of objections from concerned residents on Woolley Grange and beyond. We are pushing for further investigations to be carried out into the potential health risks this proposal subjects us all to and will of course let residents know more when we know more!
